This programme does have a cost to run, however this is being covered by BoT funds supported by the Special Character Levy.


### **Hip Hop Dance**

With the extra warm temperatures this year, swimming is certainly an attractive part of the school day! A key area of the swimming programme is the development of water confidence and basic swimming skills. It's great to see classes using our school pool to develop water confidence in a fun way.



Swimming Competition for primary aged children begins in schools around the BOP at Year 5. At this level children have the opportunity to represent their school at Cluster events, after which they are able to also compete at WBOP events if successful. For this reason BC Primary have a Year 5 and 6 Swimming Sports at Greerton Pools. At this event our top swimmers are identified and they then go to the North Cluster event.

In recent years we have also run a Year 3 and 4 Swimming Sports at Greerton pools. This has involved a day out of school for the event plus an extra day out for a practice swim. We have been reflecting on this event and have had concerns around the readiness of our Year 3 and 4 students for this level of organised competition. With high numbers of these younger students having limited confidence in the deeper pools, we have decided to remove this event from our calendar.

The focus for Year 3 and 4 will shift to one of skill and confidence development in our swimming lesson time. Classes will participate in year group based and age appropriate fun activities.
