### **SAFE**SURFER

Safe surfer is a Social Enterprise that was started by two local Christian techies that exists to help families stay safe online. This organisation provides an app that can protect a device and also a device that can be installed in the home to protect all devices on the network.

#### Screen Time Management

One of the biggest challenges for parents can be managing screen time. There are a number of tools out there that can support this. One option is **Our Pact**, which is an app that is installed on your child's iPad. Using this app you can set screen limits for children in a range of ways.
