"What's the most important thing parents can do to make their kids super learners? Talk to them. Language. Language is the key" Professor John Hattie.

A chance for parents to consider how important oral language development and competence is for children to become "super learners," and to gain effective literacy skills in reading and writing.

Talking is our primary thinking tool. Children need a wide vocabulary, an understanding of grammar and to be able to participate in conversations. - Jane Van de Zeyden

This workshop will give you some ideas of the important things that both preschool and school-aged children need to know about oral language and how you can support them at home. This will include:

- Reading to your children
- Using nursery rhymes
- What to do when you hear grammatical errors
- How to use everyday events to start a rich conversation with your child.
