Kia ora Parents/Caregivers,

We are looking forward to quite a few events over the coming weeks before the holidays. The Year 5 & 6 talent quest is an exciting time for children to be able to share their God-given gifts and talents. Then of course in the last week of school we will have parent/student/teacher conferences where there is a wonderful opportunity to share learning and goals moving forward.

Here is a reminder about our reporting this term:

Sharing your child's progress is an important part of the partnership between school and home.

We achieve this through:

- 1. Seesaw journals providing varied samples of your child's learning in an ongoing manner throughout the year.
- 2. Children bringing home finished work e.g. a project completed in school.
- 3. Teacher/Student/Parent goal setting conferences are held 5 weeks after the start of term 1 then again at the end of term 2.
- 4. A progress summary providing the NZ curriculum level progress for Reading, Writing and Mathematics, along with effort and attitude in these areas, plus a statement regarding students BC Learner growth is shared at conferences in Term 2.
- 5. A full written report at the end of the year is shared and contains progress against the NZC levels, comments for curriculum areas, effort and attitude for core areas and a BC learner comment.

Term 3 Dates: Tuesday 3rd August - 31 August (5 sessions)

Please note there is a morning session in the PAC Foyer area 8:45am-10:15am and an evening session, *7pm to 8:30pm. Venue: L block at BC.*

Any changes will be sent to participants. The course is hugely engaging, practical and biblically based.
