They sat in their respective squares and played the game from a sitting position so that Arlo wasn't disadvantaged in any way. There was just as much enthusiasm for the game, plenty of laughter, skill fun. As kaimahi/staff, we were incredibly encouraged that these tamariki had made a decision out of love and respect for their friend, ensuring he could play and wasn't left out. No kaiako/teacher suggestion, the idea had been generated by these tamariki. Obviously, they had found a way of not compromising the rules of the game or the boundaries of Handball, and in the process had challenged themselves to extend their skills. Attitude and actions had been fuelled by aroha, and community, culture and connection were strengthened, setting an inspirational model for others to follow. When our young people live as God calls us each to, we see benefits that go well beyond the academic. Lifelong principles, priorities and practices implemented right in front of our eyes. There is plenty of learning for us as adults. No wonder Jesus said that the children can lead and teach us so much. 
