Dear wonderful BC Chapman whānau,

Welcome to Term 3! We trust you had a lovely holiday break with your tamariki despite the fact we were somewhat restricted by the wet weather. First week back and we have already navigated further wet days to the credit of our kaimahi/staff and rangatahi/young people. Sometimes being forced to be inside together with its limitations, gives us greater opportunity to put 'love/aroha' into action, as we negotiate with and prefer the interests of others, ahead of our own. Our Scripture passage clearly states that love comes from God and part of knowing Him, is expressing His love. In the same way, God showed His love to us by sending Jesus, so that we could know restored relationship with God.

COLLECTION OF TAMARIKI AFTER SCHOOL


