NZ Fist Ball @ WorldGames

Past Bethlehem College students - Kelsey Randrup and Brieana Booth were selected as part of New Zealand's first ever women's Fist Ball team to represent our country at the World Games in Birmingham, Alabama, USA. Kelsey was also named captain of the team, which played exceptionally well during the tournament defeating hosts USA to finish 5th overall.

Fist Ball is thought to be of Italian origin and dates back to 1786. Played like Volleyball, teams attempt to hit the ball into the oppositions court in a way that they cannot return it over the net. The first IFA world championships were held in 1968 and the first women's world championships were held in 1994.
