Special thanks to Mrs. Sanders for all her behind the scenes planning and organisation to make this week such a success, and fun for students as they grow in their numeracy understandings.



















## WRITING



Each session is set up with a lovely visual and tactile theme of the current season, building that sense of the metaphor that no season lasts forever, each is unique and important for our growth, each has its own story, there are easy days and difficult days, seasons can be unpredictable, we each experience them differently and need to change ourselves to adapt for them, and that change is often silent, gradual and unseen.

The sessions are completely confidential. Trust and deep connections are fostered. Unless a child's safety is at risk, they do not share anyone's story.
