My role in the schools has mostly been in introducing PE and encouraging the teaching of literacy. I have absolutely loved seeing the joy that such a simple 30 minute lesson outside can bring to a classroom of children. I have also noticed that it is not just the students who have been loving these PE lessons, but a lot of the teachers join in and become just as competitive and excited, if not more so, than the children.

A highlight these past few months has been working alongside another organisation called Beyond Ourselves Zambia to train teachers in the Jolly Phonics programme of literacy learning. After training our own Limapela and Luyando teachers, I have been encouraged to see them implementing these fun and engaging practices into their own classrooms.

Thankfully, the Kafakumba Singers accepted me as a part of their family from the start, and I have really enjoyed getting to know these young people and others around the community through the different outings and events. I loved running a holiday program with lots of children in the Kafakumba community during the last school holidays, and have been asked by many children and parents to do so again in the quickly approaching Christmas holidays. Our current Year 6 students, moving into Year 7 2023 will need to purchase an iPad. Please buy an iPad Air 2/iPad 2017 or newer. (Please no iPad Pro 12.9 inch as there is limited security at school for these and we don't recommend iPad mini. The smaller screen can cause difficulty when creating and using documents.) Because of the Global shortage, please order your iPad early, as delivery can be from six to eight weeks. Check out the specifications on the Bethlehem College website HERE



YEAR 6-9 Recommended iPad Devices

Please be aware that there is a Global shortage of devices at the moment and ordering a device from retailers this year is advised. The shipping time is between 6-8 weeks.

Notes

We highly recommend that a Bluetooth keyboard case is purchased with the device as it helps to protect the device and will be much
more comfortable to type on for extended periods. These can vary in price dependent on the iPad model but usually sit in the \$80\$150 range.

If the above recommended devices are not suitable or you wish to pick your own we do recommend to get a device meeting these minimum specifications in order to insure ease of use and longevity.

- iPad Air 2/iPad 2019/ iPad 5th Gen (IOS 15 supported devices) or newer
- 32GB or higher as storage needs are always growing with higher quality photos and videos.
- We do NOT recommend iPad Minis as the smaller screen can cause difficulty when creating and using documents.
