

HEAD OF SCHOOL LETTER 10 MARCH 2023

Kia ora wonderful BC Chapman whānau,

My sister gave me what she called a 'random' present on Christmas Day this past year. It was a pair of my mother's knitting needles and a couple of balls of cotton with which you can knit those lovely facecloths that cost the earth to buy. They happen to be my favourite! She had absolutely no idea that I had decided last October that our BCC curriculum theme for 2023, would be 'Connections and Celebrations'. Over the following couple of days, I began to knit. At first even 'casting on' the stitches took a few attempts. Deep in the recesses of my memory, the knowledge and the skills were embedded, and eventually I had the knack. The amount of pleasure and sense of success I received, was well beyond what I expected. Added to this, was the sub conscious realization that God was teaching me a whole lot of truths about 'connections and celebrations'.

It was a beautiful picture of growing community and the connection it involves. Every stitch is connected, no single stitch exists in isolation. It requires skills to create a stitch and then extra cotton to grow and connect it to others. The right amount of tension weaves and holds it in place. Such tension isn't always comfortable, but it is how we grow. Some flexibility is required as we are connected on every side. A pattern emerges, a pattern of consistency and beauty, a reflection of the knitter's plan for the finished product. If along the way a stitch is dropped, it rapidly creates a hole. To repair it, the entire facecloth needs to be unraveled, all the way back to that point. Picking up the stitches takes extra patience, and perseverance, however it can be retrieved no other way.

I thought about our BC Chapman whānau, our community and of the intentionality, with which we are connected because God brings us together. He is creating a stronger community, one which reflects His beauty, His plan, His love. We have a unique part to play, one in which we recognize the joy and strength of being connected to one another, a reminder that God has the big picture of which we are an integral part. It's a real joy to watch the connections between our tamariki, our kaiako and our immediate and wider whānau. We are excited about what God is doing in our BC Chapman whanau, through the connections we have.


