One day Jesus and his disciples crossed the Sea of Galilee in a fishing boat. A storm comes up and the disciples are afraid for their lives. Jesus is asleep in the boat. Filled with the fear of drowning, they shake Jesus awake. It's a brief but intriguing story found in Luke 8: 22-25 and painted evocatively by Rembrandt.

Two things stand out as we ponder this story. Jesus doesn't forecast the weather, here Jesus controls the weather. In fact, he bosses the weather around. That would be a good reason for the disciples to question who they understood Jesus to be. But there is another reason. After Jesus calms the storm, they are now more afraid of Jesus than they were of the storm. In response the disciples ask, "Who is this?" It's a good and probing question, one we all need to grapple with.
