






Y2 BIBLES








PRIMARY SPORT

LEARNING SUPPORT NEWS








The Sensory Room is a calm and restorative space designed to help students regulate, reset, and return to learning. It includes soft furnishings, weighted resources, lighting, and sensory tools to support emotional regulation and wellbeing. This space provides a safe environment for students who are feeling overwhelmed, anxious, or dysregulated, allowing them to re-centre before reengaging in class. It also supports students with sensory processing needs through both calming and alerting activities, tailored to individual requirements. The Sensory Room is available to any student across the school, with a counsellor or support staff always present to provide support if needed.


