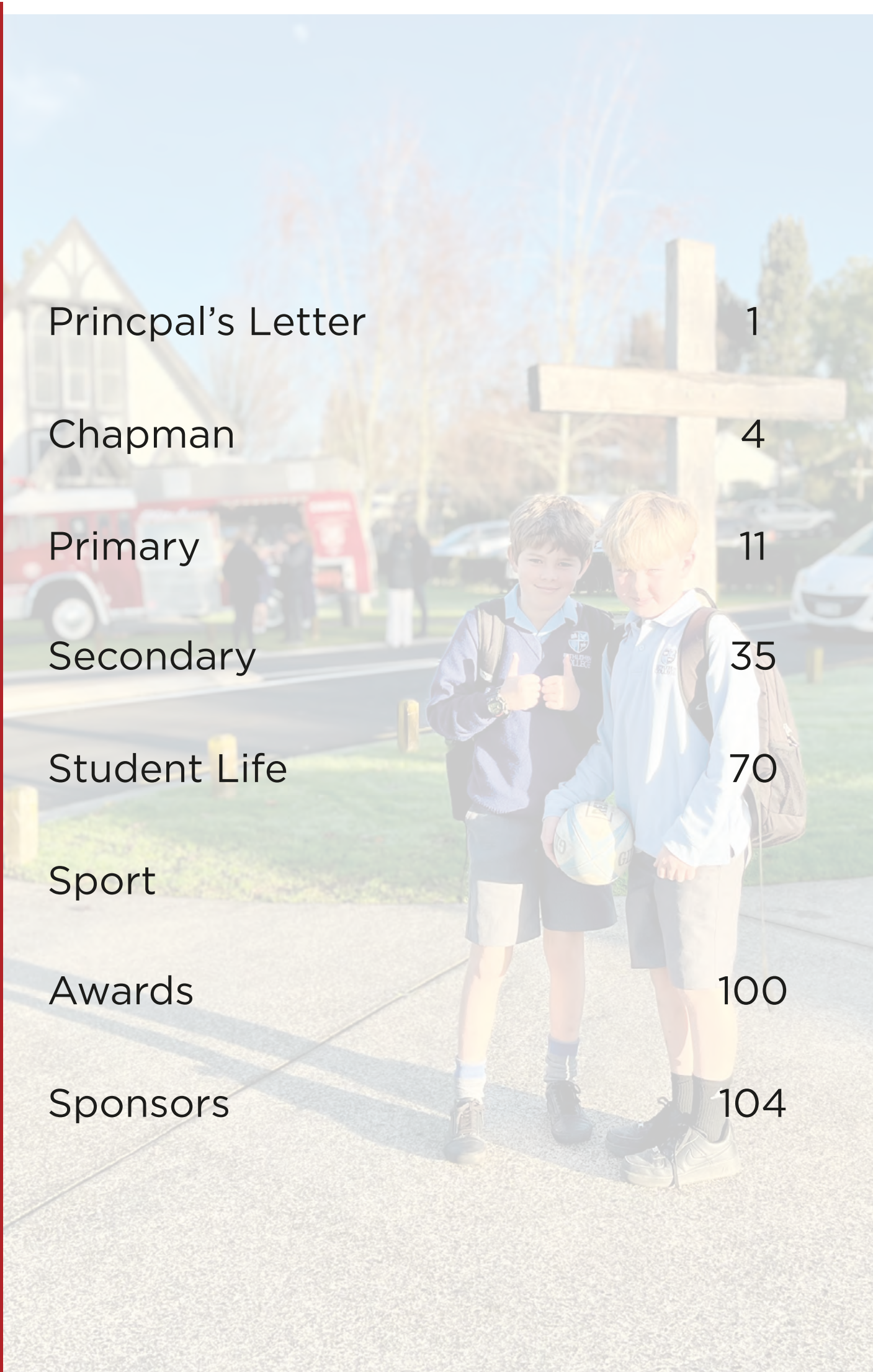

May the love, joy, and peace of our God be yours this Christmas, and always.



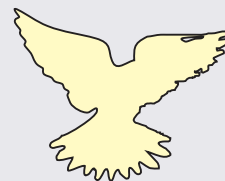

Our 2025 theme 'Grace and Gratitude' has been intentionally woven through our Teaching and Learning program and kura culture. In the Western World of 'entitlement', our prayer is that we might seek to live, as Scripture teaches us, with grateful hearts. Focus on Jesus leads to contentment and can be expressed in counter-cultural God honouring ways: in daily conversations of encouragement and thankfulness, playing on the sports field, community organizations, and at church. In other words, 'grace & gratitude' are naturally lived. Bethlehem College Primary has had a wonderful year, partnering with families to provide a Christ-centred, biblically grounded education that nurtures active learners, courageous thinkers, collaborative team players, and children with servant hearts. Guided by our themes—God Made Community, God Has Purpose, and God Is Creator—we have seen our students grow in faith, character, and knowledge throughout 2025.

The year began with a joyful community picnic, where families connected and built friendships that will continue to flourish. Early highlights included the Year 6 trip to Totara Springs, where students developed courage and resilience through engaging activities. Our swimming sports showcased enthusiasm and perseverance. Year 5 explored local history through visits to The Elms and Gate Pa, while Year 3 learned valuable water safety lessons in a creative 'Titanic swim'. Cultural celebrations brought our diverse community together, and civvies days encouraged servant-hearted generosity supporting causes near and far.

As the year progressed, our ANZAC assembly reminded us of the importance of character traits like courage and mateship, while science lessons deepened appreciation for God's intelligent design. The school Gobsnacked production The Beetles gave students the chance to shine and celebrate their unique talents – our leading cast members were magnificent. Book Week, cross country events, and representation at cluster competitions provided further opportunities for growth and achievement.

Student leaders gathered to plan and serve, inspired by visits from secondary

head students and community support. Hands-on learning in Te Aka connected children with history and tradition through activities like butter making and damper cooking, while our Te Kari team learned about flight and visited Classic Flyers. Our Year 5 and 6 students learned about bike safety and wellbeing, supported by Tauranga City Council, while choir and speech performances highlighted the talents of many.

The warmer months brought athletics day, the kapa haka festival Te Rā Rehia, and celebrations for Year 6 students preparing to move into junior secondary. The year concluded with a wonderful celebration service and heartfelt class award ceremonies, acknowledging every student's growth in Godly character and the many achievements across our school community.

We are deeply grateful for God's blessings in 2025. The commitment of our staff, the joy of our students, and the ongoing support of our whānau have made this year truly special at Bethlehem College Primary.

I remember those summer days I would come home and find her outside. I would watch as she gingerly picked up a seedling, holding it close to her as if it were her own child. I remember the smell of earth on her hands (God forbid she ever wore gloves) and her beaming smile that radiated like the sun. The words, "How was your d'ay, darling?" escaped her lips every time; it melted my heart. Not the literal words, of course, but the underlying message: she cared for me, and I cared for her...deeply. As she cleaned up, I would go inside and make us tea, then patiently wait for her in the sunroom. Glass and iron replaced wood and plaster as walls, and, as we talked, light would pour in. It was especially beautiful at night when we had those long evening discussions (as one does) and the pale moonlight would cast blankets of blue and white over everything. She would always be the one who would start and end the conversation; I usually would just sit and listen. Her dazzling eyes would dart this way and that way as she waved her hands around, fluttering here and there as if they were caught on a strong wind. Oh, if the glass walls in that room could talk, they would recount such wondrous memories! One day, after she had left to visit her parents, I received a telephone call. It was her mother, who told me she had spun out on the road and crashed. I remember crying that night. I remember sitting in the sunroom hearing the soft pitter-patter on the glass. It was like heaven was weeping with me, though I did not understand why it did so; it had just been gifted back one of its angels. I remember looking up through steamy eyes to her chair, realizing her presence would never again accompany me on those pale moonlit nights. She was gone. Forever. I spent the rest of the season locked up inside, slowly transforming into a hermit. Without her, the house felt empty. I felt empty. Eventually, I did go out (I needed groceries), only to find a blanket of snow covered everything, including her garden. Once a masterpiece, all remaining was either withered, drooping, or bare. Wiping a couple more tears from my puffy eyes, I did set off, only to come home that night and cry some more. The sunroom never did seem to be as elegant as it once was. Even on nice days, the sun's apricity always felt artificial, as if it knew my heart needed a topping-up of happiness. Eventually, I moved out of the room completely and covered up the windows and furniture...

An excerpt from 'Knock' by Phoebe Hamill Year 11

Right, left, right, left, right, left, right, left. Back and forth and back and forth. The door is right there. All I have to do is knock. I don't even have to knock, I could tap it gently, or call out. Or, I could just wait out here for Mr. King to come out on his own. But what if someone comes down the hallway? What if this person asks what I'm doing and I have to explain that I can't do something as simple as knocking on a door? Or what if the bell goes before he comes out and I have to go to class? And what if while I'm in class he goes home, and I lose my only opportunity? One, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight. Right, left, right, left, right, left, right, left. What if I knock too softly, and he doesn't hear me? Or what if he does hear me, but doesn't want to see me? Even if he did hear me and invite me in, what if I don't hear him? Oh, why can't I just knock! Come on, Beth, it's a simple thing. You've done this hundreds of times before, just knock on the door. What has gotten into me? It's not like this is some big conversation that has the potential to change the course of my school career forever. In fact, not having this conversation is almost preferable. That way, things will all stay the same and I'll have the same classes, and the same grades, and the same teachers, and I won't have to talk to all the scary teachers, and the only person I'll be letting down is myself, but that's – No, stop that Beth, that's spiralling. You need to have this conversation, and you know you need to have this conversation, so just have the darn conversation! If I can plan the conversation, then I'll be able to do it, that usually works. . I'll knock, and say 'Excuse me, Mr. King, sir, but I'd like to talk to you about my classes.' He will hear me, and invite me in, and I will hear him say 'Yes, come in. Beth, was it?' And I'll say 'Yes, sir. I want to talk to you about the classes I'm supposed to be taking next year, and I was wondering if I could switch out one or two of them?' We will sit, and he'll show me the classes they have me taking, and I'll say 'Can I swap out physics with chemistry, sir?' He'll consider it, and his consideration will not make me just as anxious as I am now, because I am not anxious at all right now, just a tad bit nervous and planning out the same way I plan out every single nerve inducing conversation I've ever had. Since subjects haven't been confirmed yet, it's only a few weeks after they were to be submitted, he'll agree and make those changes and ask me 'And you said one or two? What was the other one you wanted to change?' 'Computer studies for photography, sir.' 'Of course, and is there a reason for this change in heart? You seemed quite strong in your physics and computer studies tests.' I'll say 'No, just some miscommunication between my parents and I about the timing of subject selection and what was already selected. Thank you sir, have a good day.' I'll leave, and he won't stop me and prolong the conversation, and I'll go back to lunch and studying for exams and everything will be fine. I look at the door. I just have to knock. That's it. That's all. My arm is heavy, but I force it up. Breathe, Beth, just count to ten. My hand is already in a fist, so tight I don't think it's possible to force it open. The door is right there, so I finally, slowly, painfully, bring my hand up, and knock.

Hospitality

Early Childhood

They also attended an excellent Career Day workshop. The highlight of each year is the week-long student practicum for the Year 12 and Year 13 ECE class. The lead up to this event is always exciting as students prepare to practise the skills they have learnt during the year. They create introductory posters and write their pepeha. Having visited students on their practicums in July, it was evident that they enjoyed their time at the centres, and some have decided to pursue a career in Early Childhood. This is very heartening. Physical & Outdoor Education

Health & Physical Education

Health & Physical Education at Bethlehem College offers a broad and engaging curriculum designed to support the holistic development of our students. The programme includes Core Health & Physical Education for Years 10 and 11, as well as Sports Science and High Performance Sports Science for Years 11–13. In 2025, we reintroduced Health as a subject across Years 10–13. Our curriculum is built around four key pillars: Personal Health & Physical Development, Movement Concepts & Motor Skills, Relationships with Other People, and Healthy Communities & Environments.

- Personal Health & Physical Development focuses on personal growth, regular physical activity, safety management, and the development of personal identity.
- Movement Concepts & Motor Skills covers skill development, positive attitudes, the application of science and technology, and the influence of challenges and socio-cultural factors.
- Relationships with Other People explores the value of positive relationships, fostering sensitivity, respect, and strong interpersonal skills.
- Healthy Communities & Environments encourages students to consider the wider communities they belong to, increasing awareness of societal attitudes and values, community resources, rights, responsibilities, laws, and the relationship between people and the environment.

In 2025, Health has been reintroduced in several ways: one lesson per week in Year 10 (replacing one Physical Education period), three-week rotations in Year 11, and as online courses for Year 12 and 13 students during study classes.



Outdoor Education

Outdoor Education is a dynamic subject available to Year 12 and 13 students, offering learning experiences beyond the classroom. Recognised as a university-approved course, it provides opportunities to develop skills in leadership, social responsibility, and risk management.

In Year 12, students explore how these concepts influence both themselves and others, while participating in hands-on activities. In Year 13, they take their knowledge further, designing and leading their own projects, and applying their skills in real-life outdoor situations.





This year has been an incredible one for the Art Department, filled with growth, creativity, and recognition. One of the key highlights was our Senior Art Tūrangwaewae exhibition, where students powerfully expressed their sense of belonging and connection through their artworks. We also celebrated the exciting news of one of our painting students being accepted into the 2025 Secondary School Awards, a testament to the talent and dedication being nurtured within our classrooms. Another proud moment was the selection of eight student artworks for the prestigious Ringa Toi exhibition at Te Papa, showcasing Māori and Pasifika excellence in the arts on a national stage. Beyond these achievements, our department has continued to grow in numbers and in spirit, with students creating works that celebrate God's creation and their unique voices. It has truly been a year of success, creativity, and celebration for our Art Department.
